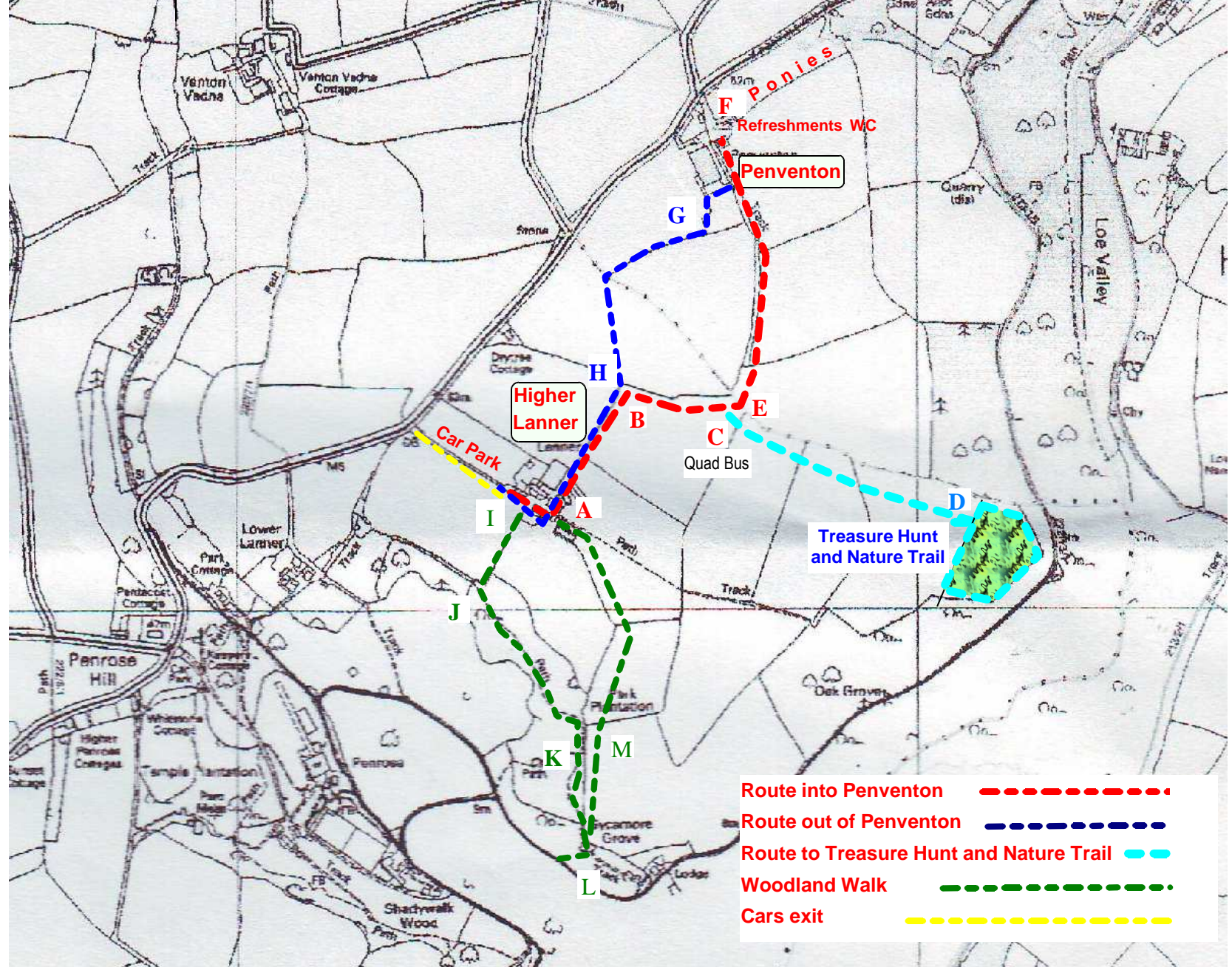
Higher Lanner Farm

All the corn and minerals are stored and mixed in a large feeder wagon and taken to the cattle. You will see the "Crimped Wheat" pile in the middle bay.

Penventon Farm

The milking cows are kept here and you can see the milking parlour, cubicles, silage and maize storage.

Calves are kept at Penventon for the first month and moved to Treza or Higher Penrose where they are reared to rejoin the herd in about 2 years when they have their first calf.

The tour will be in two parts. Follow the red line into Penventon - There is the option at [C] to walk or take the "Quad bus" down into the Treasure Hunt and Nature Trail area [D] where you will see land set aside to encourage Nature and Wild animals. Retrace your steps to rejoin the Red line [E] and continue to Penventon.

When you are ready for the second part of your tour please assemble by the garden gate [F] where a Guide will meet you.

The Woodland walk [I] is for the more energetic who would like to walk down to Loe Pool and back.

Do not allow your children to go into areas that have been marked off.
